Luke 5:8; 1 Corinthians 14:14; Isaiah 6:5, 7

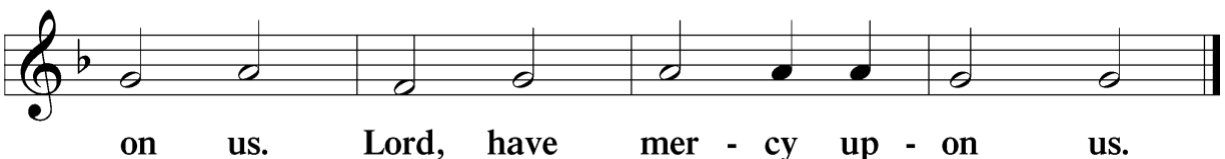
- P Seeing Jesus' power, Peter blurted out, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord."


